Dear Friends

Since our enforced closure due to the Covid Pandemic the Elders have been taking stock of the new situation that we, and everyone, find ourselves in. Much has changed, and we are only slowly getting back to what has been termed the 'new normal'.

The changes of the past two years, unwelcome though they were, have given us an opportunity to take stock and ask some questions about the life of the church. What is God saying to us? Where is God leading us? What do we need to let go of? What might re-start? What might be re-shaped? What will enable us to grow? Lots of questions!

In order that we might begin to work out some answers we invite you to be part of two exciting new things

Coffee and Prayer mornings – on the alternate Saturday to the regular coffee morning, this is an opportunity to 'Drop-In' to the church for any length of time for a coffee and to join in the prayers. Led prayer on the half-hour, prayer sheets to guide your thinking if you would prefer to pray alone and time to be quiet with God in the worship space if that is most helpful to you. Renewed Beginnings – four sessions to help us all to think about the present for our congregation, our neighbourhood, our mission and our response. These sessions will run for about an hour after service and with a shared lunch – dates to be confirmed, but in the Autumn. They will be fun and let everybody have a chance to say what you think. Please try to come along as these sessions are very important as we walk with God into the future.

It is really good to be sharing some of my time with you and to part of the life of Cheadle Hulme URC; I hope that through these initiatives we can pray together and work together to build on all that you have achieved up to now and to further grow a part of God's Kingdom in this community.

ALL MEMBERS & ADHERENTS...

Dear Friends, Is anyone back to normal? After two years of pandemic and lockdown, and Covid still with us (thankfully, for most, in a much weaker form), we can now worship together in person and find fellowship again. But for most of us it is not simply a return to how it used to be; some people have not returned to church, some have died or become too frail, some churches have closed and others considering it. Now we have significant European turmoil and its likely effect on fuel and food prices for us in the UK.

Thank God that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (HEB 13: v8). Whatever else changes, He is our rock, our cornerstone.

Financially, things were extremely tough for 2021. churches in Plate offerings had collapsed; some regular givers had to reduce or entirely stop giving to support God's work; and those churches which hire out their premises had seen income from that source disappear. Even those churches where the majority of the giving was by standing order or bank transfer (if you have not considered regularising your giving in this way, please do - it helps your treasurer significantly) may have seen a 20%+ drop in income.

If this had been replicated in giving to the M&M Fund in 2021, we might have been faced with a serious financial crisis last year.

But no, through the generosity of individuals, churches and Synods, we can report that income only fell by 4.4%. With a similar reduction in expenditure the M&M Fund result



was a deficit of only £80,000 (less than half a percent of income), a deficit that can be comfortably covered by reserves.

So, thank you to all who continued to contribute to your local church, thank you to all those churches who met their commitment for 2021 in full, and thank you to all those who, in adversity, continued to treat the M&M Fund as the first priority and paid what they could.

With churches and individuals under financial pressure, 2022 is not going to be an easy year either. The M&M Fund budgeted income (based on Synods' projections) will not be sufficient to cover expected costs and we are reconciled to dipping into our reserves more seriously as a result.

However, if we "ordinary Christians" are to fulfil the call of Jesus to be His witnesses in the world around us we need ministers and other workers "on the ground" and we need shared resources which are often best created centrally. That all comes from the M&M Fund.

CHRISTIAN BASICS #8 ~ PRAYER

Most of us identify with the disciples' request: 'Lord, teach us to pray' (Luke 11:1); having seen Jesus pray, they wanted to know <u>how</u> to pray!

A Loving Relationship

Jesus begins with *father*. *'When you pray, say: Father'* (2). Prayer is like a child asking their parent for help. This reflects Jesus' own intimate relationship with His Father. He invites us to share this relationship using the Lord's Prayer, as way into His presence (2-4). Imagine using this prayer as a child sitting on your parent's lap. God delights to hear us!

A Loving Readiness

Jesus' parable makes the point that God is always ready to hear our prayer. When the man turns up at midnight asking for bread, his friend inside gives him whatever he needs because of his *'shameless boldness' (lit)'* (v.8). If the man answers despite all his family being asleep, *how much more* will our Father in heaven respond to our prayers. We should never give up!

A Loving Richness

Jesus concludes with a threefold promise: 'ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.' (9). Does this mean that God will give us whatever we ask for? As earthly parents only give good things to their children, how much more is this true of our heavenly Father: 'Which of you fathers, if your son asks for a fish, will give him a snake instead? Or if he asks for an egg, will give him a scorpion?' (11,12). He doesn't give us everything we want, but what is best for us.

'If God were to say to me, 'I want to give you a special love gift, what would you like?' I would say: 'you choose'' (SD Gordon).


