Rev Roy Martin, BA, BD died on 1 FEB following a brief illness. Roy was the minister at Cheadle Hulme between 1956-61 and later went to India as a missionary. His funeral is being held in Milton Keynes on Tues 4 March (available on YouTube) and our thoughts and prayers are with his widow, Joy.

REV ROY MARTIN

The Rev H R Martin, B.A., B.D., came to us from Northern College in 1956, and his guiet enthusiasm for his work and his absolute sincerity won the support of the Church. In his first year, Family Church was started in place of the Sunday School, and this has been a success, but the accommodation available was inadequate. A great improvement was made in 1960, when a new corridor was built, with a new kitchen and toilet block, a new entrance to the Dorcas Room, alterations which turned the old "annexe" into the present Lesser Hall (now coffee lounge, Ed). and Mrs Martin started the Young Wives Meeting, which is now the Women's Circle. Mr Martin's real interest in Missionary work met a good response in the Church and over the last few years our contribution to the Missionary funds has more than trebled. The response was most marked among the young people, and this was helped by the arrival of Mr and Mrs Cairns and their family, who worked very hard in Junior Church and the Youth Group.

RITA MARGARET HISCOTT


Rita was born in Denton in 1939 and attended school in Gorton whilst teaching Sunday school in the local Methodist. She loved dancing and took part in local shows. She then attended Loreto College to learn shorthand typing and joined an Insurance Brokers. It was there that she met Geoff and they were married at Aspinal church in in 1960.

They set up home in Woodley where their two sons, Simon and Jeremy, were born in 1963 and 1965. In 1967 they moved to Bramhall and attended Swann Lane URC. Soon after, Rita was setting up a playgroup with other friends and joined a Scottish Country Dance group staying with the group for over 25 years, even after moving to Prestbury. In 1970, their daughter Angela was born and all 3 children attended Hursthead Junior School where Rita worked as a playground assistant and dinner lady later becoming school secretary. Rita was very fond of flower arranging, winning a number of prizes over the years at local shows.

There were holidays in the Isle of Wight, South of France, Italy and Switzerland along with cruises to the Mediterranean and Greek Islands. More recently European river cruises and tours in the USA, Canada, South Africa and the Caribbean. However, particular favourites In the UK were Sidmouth in Devon and the Lake District.

In 2008, Rita was diagnosed with ovarian cancer but following a number of operations she was declared cancer free in 2021, although a stroke the year before meant she could no longer drive. She bore her limitations without losing her of humour, sense enjoying a full life and holidays until she suffered a second, more severe, stroke in July 2024 leaving her with major disability. She passed away on 31 January 2025 in the Nursing Home, surrounded by her family. A much loved wife, mother and grandmother, she will be greatly missed by all her family and many friends.
