### NORMAN ROBERT LAWRENCE

Norman was born in Edinburgh in 1941, the 7th child of 8. His early years of education began at Trinity Academy Primary School. At the age of 15 he began an apprenticeship as a compositor progressing to estimator, (gaining his City & Guilds in Estimating and Costing); then chief appointed as Assistant to estimator, then Financial Director H.P. Dorey in Romford, when the family moved to Chelmsford. Yes, you could guess what happened next... yet more promotion: Commercial Manager to Production Director. In1980 promotion to Managing Director and then in 1991 he joined an old colleague at CW Print as Director of Production, where he helped build a successful and profitable company.

Back in 1959, he met Rena at Cavendish Dance Hall; their relationship developed and they were married. Robert was born in 1966 and in 1971 they welcomed Graeme. He retired in 1999 and in 2010 they relocated to Cheadle Hulme to have an opportunity of being involved in the lives of their grandchildren.

Everyone thought Norman was a '**nice**' man -which means: natural, intelligent, compassionate, and empathetic.

Norman was someone who achieved success and lived well, laughed often and loved much, who enjoyed the respect of intelligent people and the love of little children, who filled his niche and accomplished his task; who left the world better than he found it, who always looked for the best in others and gave the best he had; whose life was an inspiration, whose memory a benediction - such a man was Norman.

# QUESTION TIME WITH OUR M.P. **TOM MORRISON**

This meeting held on Saturday afternoon 12 July at Grove Lane Baptist Church was arranged by Churches Together in Cheadle TOGETHER Hulme and was open to anyone IN CHEADLE HULME



from the local churches. It was good to meet with thirty other Christians there, five from our church.

Tom answered questions on a huge variety of topics - the questions just kept coming! Some had been sent in advance, but most were impromptu.

Tom was very clear to tell us he had not got all the answers and if he did not have an answer he would find out and let the questioner know by email. He was also clear about when an answer was official Lib Dem policy (the majority) or when he was taking about his own views and would need to find out the official policy.

The topics covered began with local issues -Stepping Hill Hospital – the desperate need for repairs and a possible second hospital. Following the tragedy at a local Nursery Tom is working on an Early Day Motion regarding laws to improve safety in Nursery provision. The NHS funding problems were discussed as well as the current concern re the possible Resident Doctors Strike. We then covered a wide range of issues - from the problems affecting Hong Kong Visas to the Birmingham dustbin worker's strike which led onto council tax, business rates, bank levies... The situation re Prisons was discussed, with the need for rehabilitation highlighted and of course the funding problems.

Regarding families, the two-child benefit cap was asked about - Lib Dem's are keen to 'scrap the cap'. There was much discussion re vulnerable children and the role of local authorities with more funding needed for schools, children's homes and youth clubs. Housing also was discussed and Tom felt we need a national target for Social Housing.

Regarding Climate Change, Tom confirmed his party's commitment to reducing the use of fossil fuels and encouraging the use of green energy - this led to discussion re debt relief for countries affected by climate related emergencies, which Tom supported.

Further afield questions were asked about LibDem policy re the Israel/Gaza conflict – Tom said his party had been the first to call for a cease fire. This led to discussion re banning goods from the settlements.

The meeting lasted an hour and those I spoke to afterwards felt it had been well worth attending - Rev Ruth Gouldbourne, the Baptist Minister who chaired the meeting, is planning another meeting with Tom in January 2026.

### MARJORIE WIGHTMAN

Marjorie was born in Shipley, Yorkshire in 1930 and attended Saltaire Congregational Church from 4 years of age. Her faith was very important to her and she loved to sing, joining the choir at the age of 10.

But she certainly had many 'secrets' tucked up her sleeve' - at the age of 12, during the height of the bombing, she travelled to London to broadcast a message to a young man, who attended her local church, and who was training to be a pilot in South Africa. She doesn't tell us how it was broadcast, it may have been the BBC....or any other details other than that he was killed on his first flight.


She helped form not only a dramatic society at Church, with whom she performed, but also a walking group venturing as far afield as the Lake District and overcoming her 'horror of heights' completely as she climbed Helvellen by Striding Edge.

She started dancing which she enjoyed very much, meeting her husband John whilst out dancing in 1951 and then marrying in 1955. She joined the Civil Defence only leaving in 1958 when she was expecting Pam; adding as almost an afterthought... then had Andy in 1960. As her children married the family grew grandchildren followed by 6 great grandchildren. She enjoyed and loved them all, wonderfully describing their individual personalities.

The family moved to Cheadle Hulme in 1962 and joined Swann Lane Church, where they both played badminton; and Marjorie became an active member of the Ladies Circle **and** Womens' Fellowship. The infamous jumble sales were also on her radar - referring to them as hard work, but great fun - she must have enjoyed them as she continued to help into her 90s.

She was a true Yorkshire lass, who spoke her mind, was careful with money, but had a heart of gold and was always there for family and friends. She was the most loyal of friends, keeping in touch with her bridesmaids and school friends all her life. Marjorie was above all else, a lady, in the true sense of the word.
